Short Bio

I'm full professor for history of philosophy working primarily on the history of Late Renaissance, Early Modern and Enlightenment philosophy. I am member of the editorial boards of several periodicals, among which *Giornale Critico della Filosofia Italiana*, *Rivista di Storia della Filosofia*,

Historia Philosophica, and series (“International Archives for the History of Ideas”, “Women in the History of Philosophy and Science”, “Epicurea”).

I got in 2009 the **La Bruyère Award for Philosophy**, given by the Académie Française (Paris) for my book *Skepsis. Le débat des modernes sur le scepticisme* (Paris, Vrin, 2008) and in 2011 the **Prize of the Accademia dei Lincei** (Rome) for Philosophy. This prize is given every ten years for the scientific production of the prize winner over the past decade

He has lectured widely in Europe, North and South America, and Asia. Main research interests

His main research interests are in the history of early modern philosophy. Much of his work has been dealing with Pierre Bayle's philosophy (to whom he devoted a book: *Analisi della fede e critica della ragione nella filosofia di Pierre Bayle*, 1980), 17th and 18th libertine and clandestine philosophical culture (see notably the edition of *Theophrastus redivivus*, 1981-1982 and the book *Les philosophies clandestines à l'âge classique*, 2005), and also the scientific and philosophical traditions of modern empiricism (mainly Hobbes, Gassendi, Condillac, Hume and the Enlightenment).

He also focused on the history of 17th cent. scepticism, publishing a book on this topic (*Skepsis*, 2008), which covers several authors from Montaigne to Bayle, including true sceptics like Montaigne, Sanches, La Mothe Le Vayer, Bayle as well as some theoretical responses to scepticism (Campanella, Mersenne, Hobbes, Descartes). He has also been working on the relations between Hobbes, his contemporaries (White and some French philosophers, above all Gassendi), his humanistic and Renaissance sources (Valla, Erasmus, Lipsius, the *Corpus Hermeticum*). He is preparing a book on *The Continental Hobbes. Science and first philosophy*.

One new book on Enlightenment philosophy is under preparation: *From Scepticism to Naturalism. Bayle-Hume-Diderot* (to be submitted for publication in "Studies in the Enlightenment", Oxford University Press).

His current research regards three other main topics: Hobbes's "first philosophy" in connection with Galilean science and the French *milieu*; the history of clandestine thought in Seventeenth-Century philosophy and early Enlightenment; the intellectual relationship between Hume and Diderot.

He is also working on Hume's *Dialogues Concerning Natural Religion* and his sources, especially the French ones, related to Hume's stays on the continent.

Other areas of his interest are 20th century French philosophy and the debate on methods in history of philosophy (to these topics he devoted several articles and a large synthesis in a general history of contemporary philosophy: *La filosofia della seconda metà del Novecento*, 1998, published as a part of the general *Storia della filosofia*, dir. Mario Dal Pra).
